## THE PRINCE OF WALES BURSARY FOR THE ARTS

The Prince of Wales Bursary for the Arts was established in 2001 in recognition of HRH The Prince of Wales's Patronage of both the British School at Athens and its Appeal and to celebrate the royal Patronage, which the British School at Athens has been privileged to enjoy since its foundation.

The Bursary aims to give artists, in the widest sense of the term, **an opportunity to develop and enhance their work by spending time in Greece.** The British School at Athens is committed to the lasting and universal values of Greece and Hellenism and to contributing significantly to present day intellectual and cultural life. Applications should reflect these principles.

The award will be made annually. Its maximum value is £2,500.

The awards will be made by the Prince of Wales Bursary Committee following interviews in March and will be announced by 31 March. The Bursary will be tenable immediately and should be taken up within the following twelve months. Recipients of the Bursary must be admitted as Students of the School for the appropriate Session(s) before receiving their grant. **A brief report must be submitted to the Committee on completion of the Bursary programme.** Bursars will be asked to donate some record of their work in Greece to the School and any subsequent display of work achieved should acknowledge the award.

**Applications:** Applications should arrive by **15th January 2010** and should consist of:

- six copies of a written statement of the applicant's intentions which should include the amount requested from the Fund and a provisional work timetable which ought to include some residence at the School. This should not be longer than two pages in total;
- six copies of a curriculum vitae, together with the names and addresses of two referees;
- one set of photographs or colour copies of not more than ten pieces of work. These should not exceed A4 size, with true dimensions on the reverse (no slides or computer discs). A stamped addressed envelope should be included for their return.
