

British School at Athens Map Collection

The British School at Athens Map Collection includes cartographic records from the early 19th Century to the present day, primarily of Greece and neighbouring regions. The maps were collected by various members of the British School at Athens and the rare map collection includes a number of maps that are part of the George Finlay collection. The BSA Map Collection is predominantly based on army reconnaissance starting with the French and Austrian Staff Maps from the 19th Century, followed by the British Army maps of the 20th Century and culminating in recent Greek Army maps. The collection also includes British Admiralty Charts from the 19th Century, commercial maps and map series, thematic maps, historical atlases and miscellaneous cartographic related material.

The maps are physically organised by series (e.g. British Military “Staff Maps” from WWII in Sections 1 to 8; British Admiralty Charts in Sections 9 to 12; and H.A.G.S. Hellenic Military Maps from 1969-1977 in Section 41), by geographical location (eg. Aegean Islands in Section 24; Cyprus in Sections 32 to 33) and by special themes (eg. Geological maps in Section 30). Some series (military and non-military) as well as Thematic Maps and Monograph (single item) maps are placed generally within their geographical location. Each map is given a Section and number which combined creates a unique object number. They are filed in 5 vertical cabinets. The maps and other items in the Rare Map Collection are organised by original BSA library shelf marks (A-H) with unique numbers and are now held on numbered shelves in a separate secure cupboard.

F. Useful Information

Military maps

The largest number of maps in the BSA Map Collection come from the Austrian, British and Hellenic military. A smaller number of maps were produced by the Royal Australian Survey Corps (A.H.Q.), the French Service *Topographique de l'Armée* and the Italian *Istituto Geografico Militare*.

Austrian Military Staff Maps were produced by the army of the Austrian Empire and after 1889, the joint Austro-Hungarian Army. Its main base was Vienna and is often abbreviated as MGI. The military geographic institute is listed on the maps as *K.k. Militär-geographisches-Institut* (K.k. = *Kaiserlich-Königliches*; ca. 1839-1888), *K.u.k. Militär-geographisches-Institut* (K.u.k. = *Kaiserlich und Königliches*; 1889-1918) or after the collapse of the empire in 1918, known as the *Militärgeographisches Institut* until 1923.

British Staff Maps were produced by the Military's General Staff Geographical Service (G.S.G.S.). Until WWII, it was also known to be a part of M.I.4, a section of Military Intelligence that gathered geographical information and provided maps and charts to the forces. The surveying, cartography and printing was carried out by a number of different departments within the British Military under the auspices of the Geographical Service: various field survey companies of the Royal Engineers (R.E.), British Salonika Force (B.S.F., 1915-1918), Ordnance Survey (OS), Middle East Drawing and Reproduction (M.D.R.), War Office (WO) and its Military Intelligence Division (M.I.), Survey Training Headquarters – Middle East Forces (Survey G.H.Q., M.E.F), War Office and Air Ministry Directorate of Military Survey (D Survey), and the Royal Geographical Society (R.G.S.). Many of the maps are marked with a G.S.G.S. series number and/or have a M.D.R. Reference number. The BSA map collection contains many British Military maps dating from the early 20th century, covering both WWI and WWII. The BSA *Annual Reports* record gifts of maps from the War Office shortly after WWI and WWII.

The first geodetically based mapping of the new nation-state of Greece was conducted by the French military as part of the *Expedition de Morée*, published as *Carte de la Morée* (B 7.1 to B7.5) in six 1:200,000 scale maps in 1832. A geographically extended version of this series was produced as 20 sheets, published in Paris in 1852, as the *Carte de la Grèce* (F 1 to F 20) which was considered to be the first 'scientifically constructed' map of Greece. Although the French produced these early maps, the mapping of Greece gradually gave way to the significant influence of the Austrian military geographical institute by the second half of the 19th century.

Hellenic Army Staff Maps were produced by their geographical division which began in 1889 as part of the Austrian Army's 'Geodetic Mission' which included Greek military engineers. In 1891 the Greek military division was renamed the Geodetic Section (Γεωδαιτικών απόσπασμα) and, with the withdraw of the Austrian Army in 1895, it was renamed again as the Army Cartographic Service or Χαρτογραφική Υπηρεσία Στρατού. In 1926 it became the Army Geographic Service or Γεωγραφική Υπηρεσία Στρατού (Γ.Υ.Σ.) and, in English, was known as Hellenic Military Geographical Service (H.M.G.S.), a division of the Hellenic Army's General Staff (H.A.G.S.).

British Admiralty Charts

Hydrographic charts show various depths of water, underwater features, coastlines and harbours with measurements in nautical miles. Most of the charts in the BSA collection are revised British Admiralty Charts that date from the mid-19th to the beginning of the 20th century. Names of naval officers who held the Office of *Hydrographer of the Navy* during this time appear on many of the charts along with the names of hydrographic surveyors under their command.

Although the Admiralty Hydrographic Office was established at the end of the 18th century, navigational charts only become available for purchase in 1821. Rear-Admiral John Washington's predecessor had expanded exploration, resulting in the production of an increasing number of published charts. By the mid-19th century, improved recording techniques and steam powered vessels allowed for more detailed surveying, requiring corrections to the older charts in order to keep them up to date. In addition, the BSA *Annual Reports* for 1902/1903 -1903/1904 indicated that the Director, R.C. Bosanquet, was aiding in the “rectification of the inaccurate naming on the British Admiralty charts”, linking the BSA to the latest in the revised series of British Admiralty Charts.

Monograph Maps

Monograph maps are defined as maps that are complete in one part. This covers a large range of subjects including maps that contain a particular subject matter (i.e. theme) set in geographic areas. Bio-scientific themes are covered by such things as the 1939 *Soil Map of Euboea* (30.3) or the *Fayûm Irrigation* map (39.14) of 1892. Maps depicting historical events are also classed as Monograph maps such as the maps associated with the Greco-Turkish War of 1897 (29.10), the Balkan Wars (C 13.7 and C 13.8), the 1922 “Catastrophe” (29.2) or a 1926 commemorative map of the *Last Siege of Messolonghi* (29.12) dating a hundred years after the siege. Monograph maps also show geographic maps with standard topographic features such as the commercial maps of many of the islands, relief maps, three-quarter views, and plans. The emphasis is on the totality of the map.

Note on Map Series

The BSA Map Collection contains a number of map series, both military and commercial, that consist of numerous sheets in the same scale and labelling system, but are assigned unique identifications (numeric, alphabetic or alphanumeric codes). The maps are organised on a grid which is sometimes explained by an accompanying Index Map, a sketch map that shows the layout of the numbered series. The most prominent 19th-century military map series in the BSA collection are the Austrian Staff maps of Iphicrates Kokkidis and Heinrich Kiepert and those associated with the Austrian *Generalkarte* of Central Europe including early 20th century revisions and Hellenic Military versions. Early non-military series are *Karten von Attica* (B 1 to B5 series) by Ernst Curtius and J.A. Kaupert, *Karte von Kleinasien* (C 6 and C 7 series) by Richard Kiepert (son of Heinrich Kiepert), and *Karte des westlichen Kleinasien* (C 7.1.1 to C 7.1.6) and *Karte des Peloponnes* (23.1, 23.2 and 23.3 series) both by Dr Alfred Philippson.

Map series that do not have index maps are generally a single map broken up into several sheets. For example, Aaron Arrowsmith's map 1819 *Greece and Adjacent Countries with Modern and Antient Names* of 1819 (D 3.2 to D 3.6) is a set of map sheets of various physical sizes and when assembled in place, the decorative border and longitude/latitude scales span the entire set, not bordering all sides of the individual sheets. One of the sections of this particular Arrowsmith map (D 3.1), however, is a 1826 replacement that does not fit precisely, but covers the area left blank by the other five sheets; it also contains its own title and has borders on all four sides and can be considered a Monograph map. The six sheets of the 1838 *Carte du Royaume dela Grèce* (D 7.1 to D 7.6), attributed to Ferdinand Aldenhoven, when pieced together is equivalent to the large 1838 Monograph map, *Carte de la Royaume dela Grèce* (D 2) published by Aldenhoven at the Royal publishing house.

Prime Meridians

Longitudinal coordinates for maps in the BSA Map Collection employ a variety of Prime Meridians. All British maps use Greenwich for 0° which is the standard used today for all east-west coordinates. However, it was common in the 19th century for non-British maps to use the Ferro Meridian which is based on the western most island of the Canary Islands, El Hierro (Ferro) which is sometimes referred to as Meridian Island. The Ferro Prime Meridian is approx. 18° west of Greenwich and was used for the Austrian *Generalkarte* and a number of other early Austrian, German and Greek maps. Other Prime Meridians that were used were Paris (approx. 2° east of Greenwich) and Athens (approx. 24° east of Greenwich), respectively centred on the Paris Observatory and the National Observatory of Athens.
