'MYTH AND RELIGION'

The British School at Athens is delighted to invite UK school teachers to attend a free virtual CPD course, focusing on the OCR GCSE Classical Civilisation module 'Myth and Religion' The course is intended both for those who already teach the new GCSE (or similar specifications), and also for those who have never taught the subject before.







Participants will follow a series of **four virtual lectures**, introducing the main themes of the module and providing **case studies beyond the GCSE syllabus**. By the end of the course, **participants will have a sound working knowledge of myth and religion in Ancient Greece, helping them to teach this material to students with confidence.**
